Elyshah's Story from Linda Siegel

Elyshah (Justanilushan x Overlook Aladaluv) resided at the Humane Society of the Sierra Nevada for over 2 years before I took him home with me. He was a victim of extreme neglect when they took him from his owner. Ely arrived at our barn fearful and nervous. He was escorted to his stall where he remained for about a week as he settled into life at the barn. He loved his stall because it gave him protection, shelter, and privacy. Ely was very small and had been picked on and unable to eat. He had numerous painful summer sores when he was initially brought to the Humane Society, and these plagued him for 2 years. As Ely settled in, learned new behaviors, and became comfortable, he began to grow. He ended up at an average Arabian size of 14.2. His fearfulness decreased, and he began to seek attention. Megan came to work for us, and fell in love. Eventually, Megan left us to go to school, so we decided Ely was ready to be put under saddle. Luckily, she went to Chico and was going to live in Vina. Luckily, the McDaniels Horse Training Center was there, and I knew they would appreciate Ely's lovely conformation and movement, and had the knowledge and sensitivity that he needed. He went to school with Megan.

Now, Ely is becoming Megan's riding horse, and I think will live happily ever after with her!

North American Trail Ride Conference (NATRC)


Introducing.... the New Leisure Division B Ride

Since 1961, NATRC has helped riders of all ages learn the sport of competitive trail riding (CTR). NATRC has stood the test of time with guidelines allowing us to become the best at what we doeducating and promoting safe trail riding. The trail provides a great place to deepen your relationship with your horse while learning new skills sets. If you're a newcomer to the sport of CTR, have a young or older horse, do not have the time to condition or take time off from responsibilities, prefer a shorter distance, slower one day ride in a relaxed venue, *WE HAVE A RIDE FOR YOU*! *The new Leisure Division*<u>! *If you are new to NATRC, your*</u> first year membership is **FREE!**

This division is a one day ride, 8-12 miles in distance, 3 to 4-5 MPH, maximum of 5 observations (typically 3-4), judged by a certified NATRC Horsemanship Judge, check in morning of the ride, check out afternoon of the ride. Placings through 10th in Adult and Junior Divisions. You will receive a team scorecard giving you feedback on your participation. All breeds welcome, no restrictions on shoeing or leg protection, no camping necessary. You will accrue 10 points per completed ride, be eligible for Regional awards with year-end recognition. This is a TEAM sport and you will be observed as a *team* on the trail. It's a relaxed atmosphere for you to enjoy the beauty of the trail with your horse and friends.

We have 6-7 Leisure Division rides coming up in Region 1. This is our inaugural year for this division, come be part of our history and join us. - **1. USEF** RULES ARE TO APPLY EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE NOTED.
- 2. RIDING APPAREL –ENGLISH/WESTERN RIDERS MUST WEAR BOOTS & LONG SLEEVE SHIRTS & HATS. HELMETS (ASTM APPROVED) REQUIRED IN ENGLISH CLASSES FOR AGES 18 & UNDER AND HIGHLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL RIDERS WHILE RIDING ON THE COMPETITION GROUNDS. CHAPS AND HUNT COATS ARE OPTIONAL.
- **3. JUNIOR HORSE** is one that is 5 years and under.
- **4.** MAIDEN Horse or Rider that has not won 1^{ST} place ribbons at Any Show in the division entered.
- TRAINING EQUIPMENT PERMITTED: Hackamores (bosal), snaffle bits and training aids (i.e., draw reins, running martingales, German martingales). No mechanical Hackamores allowed. Riders may use two hands on reins.
- 6. **STALLIONS** may not be shown by rider/handler who is under 18 years of age.
- 7. PARENTS/TRAINERS will supervise children and their mounts at all times.
- 8. **PONIES** allowed in all classes.
- 9. DOGS AND ALL OTHER PETS must be kept on a leash at all times.
- **10. CLASSES** with less than three (3) entries may be cancelled or combined.
- **11. LEADLINE RIDERS** may not enter any other riding class.
- **12.** WALK/TROT CLASSES entries in walk/trot classes OTHER THAN 10 & UNDER may enter other classes in the show.
- **13. ONE-MINUTE GATE RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
- 14. COLOR CLASS Open to Appaloosa, Buckskins, Duns, Paints, Pintos, and Palominos. Excludes Bays, Greys, Blacks and Chestnuts.
- **15.** CLASSIC HEAD CLASS Horse must wear **unlettered** sheet, blanket or cooler.

- 17. Perpetual Trophies must show or submit a copy of registration papers.

- 19. For the safety of all, exhibitors will not be allowed to unhook trailers on the show grounds.




