

SOME EFFECTS OF DROUGHT ON HORSES

Here it is, 11 p.m. on 2/29/2020, and I am waiting in Loomis to see if we make history with no rain in February. This is a leap-year, so we have this extra day, and I wonder how that affects it all. As of 10 a.m., my phone told me that we have no rain until next week, but then it changed, so I am watching, but so far – nothing.

How does this affect our horses? For the trail rider it is heaven - there is no mud, there are no "nonriding" days due to rain; cool nights and warm days are perfect. For the horse, it might not be so perfect. There is an increased chance of riding injuries twists, muscle problems, and generally not many days of rest. On the other hand, there is no slipping in the mud, certainly no rain rot. In our area one big problem is that our soil is largely decomposed granite, and it turns to concrete when there is no water on it for long periods of time. I have one horse who looks like she has mustang trims on all four hooves, but it is just that she has been resting her weight on one hoof, then another, until she really has not much of a toe. However, this doesn't mean that she selftrims. Indeed, her quarters are grown out, and her sole needs to be trimmed up. She is arthritic, so I imagine she is very achy. Despite the drought, new grasses are coming up everywhere, and horses can

still founder. And with the cold nights, horses are still needing encouragement to drink so they don't colic. You can't really add hot water to their tubs because it gets too hot during the day.

Feeding your horse on the ground is a great idea when there is nice pasture beneath the hay, but in a drought, pastures get overgrazed, and horses start getting dust mixed in with their feed, which can lead to colic and stones. I've never thought there was a good solution to feeding on the ground, unless you are fortunate enough to have lots of green grass. My horses throw flakes of hay around – they don't leave it on a rubber mat. They pick out hay from their nets and toss it on the ground until they have enough to grab a big bite. Our only solution is to feed in the stall – the horses still sometimes carry their entire meal out to their yard, but at least they have kicked a lot of bedding out there, so it's almost like eating in the stall.

Luckily, rain is in our forecast for the next two weeks. We can only hope!



FUZZY WUZZY HORSE SHOW RULES

- 1. USEF RULES ARE TO APPLY EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE NOTED.
- 2. RIDING APPAREL -ENGLISH/WESTERN RIDERS MUST WEAR BOOTS &
- 3. LONG SLEEVE SHIRTS & HATS AND OR HELMETS. HELMETS (ASTM APPROVED) REQUIRED IN ENGLISH EQUITATION CLASSES FOR ALL AGES AND HIGHLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL RIDERS WHILE RIDING ON THE COMPETITION GROUNDS. CHAPS AND HUNT COATS ARE OPTIONAL.
- 4. JUNIOR HORSE is one that is 5 years and under.
- 5. MAIDEN Horse or Rider that has not won 1ST place ribbons at Any Show in the division entered.
- 6. TRAINING EQUIPMENT PERMITTED: Hackamores (bosal), snaffle bits and
- 7. training aids (i.e., draw reins, running martingales, German martingales). No mechanical Hackmores allowed. Riders may use two hands on reins.
- 8. STALLIONS may not be shown by rider/handler who is under 18 years of age.
- 9. PARENTS/TRAINERS will supervise children and their mounts at all times.
- 10. PONIES allowed in all classes.
- 11. DOGS AND ALL OTHER PETS must be kept on a leash at all times.
- 12. CLASSES with less than three (3) entries may be canceled or combined.
- 13. Office Fee of \$15.00 shall apply to each back # issued. Separate Back # per each horse and rider combination required.
- 14. LEADLINE RIDERS -may not enter any other riding class.
- 15. WALK/TROT CLASSES entries in walk/trot classes OTHER THAN 10 & UNDER may enter other classes in the show.
- 16. ONE-MINUTE GATE RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- 17. COLOR CLASS Open to Appaloosa, Buckskins, Duns, Paints, Pintos, and Palominos. Excludes Bays, Greys, Blacks and Chestnuts.
- 18. CLASSIC HEAD CLASS Horse must wear unlettered sheet, blanket or cooler.
- 19. NON-COMPETITIVE RIDERS may enter any class at regular fee. Exhibitor number to be worn upside down on exhibitor's back.
- 20. Perpetual Trophies must show or submit a copy of registration papers.
- 21. For the safety of all, exhibitors will not be allowed to unhook trailers on the show grounds.
- 22. Manure from exhibitor's horses must be hauled home. Please leave your area clean.
- 23. HI-POINT MUST ENTER WITH INITIAL ENTRY FORM SUBMISSION AND PAY ADDITIONAL \$4.99 ENTRY FEE FOR HI-POINT FEE. SEPARATE ENTRY FORM AND OFFICE FEE REQUIRED FOR EVERY HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION.


