YOUNG ADULT BOOKS STARRING ARABIAN HORSES


Victoria Hardesty got her first Arabian more than 36 years ago. She was introduced to the breed by a neighbor she fell absolutely in love! Soon she and her husband owned eight horses and needed a bigger place!

She and her husband bought a large property with three barns, two arenas, a round pen, hot walker, and lots of paddocks. The training barn hosted a lovely collection of riders and trainers including a young woman from Cal Poly.

Although the training barn has since closed, Victoria isn't done yet. While she was going through chemotherapy, her best friend, Nancy Perez, suggested they

write a book together. Victoria agreed as long as the book had a horse and girl in it. They both fell in love with characters Prince Ali and Becky so much so that it became a series!

One of the remarkable things about Arabian horses, besides their affinity for humans, is their ability to do just about everything. They have tried to show that in their books by incorporating different disciplines in each. They have covered main ring showing, cutting, endurance, barrel racing, and jumping. The eighth book is about a driving horse who can't be ridden and his young lady who can't walk. Victoria is working on that manuscript now.



Prince Ali – Wonder Horse
Book One is about a young
horse born into a wealthy family as the prized "best friend"
of the only child, Becky. Unfortunately, the horse becomes a
phenomenal show horse and is
stolen after a personal appearance, leaving Becky in a coma.
While Becky's parents and law
enforcement frantically search
for the young stallion, he finds
himself alone in the wilderness, desperately trying to find
his way back home to Becky.

La Duquesa – Wonder Horse Book Two is about a young "horse-crazy" girl who knows her single mother couldn't possibly afford a horse for her. Through her artwork, she finds employment at a horse ranch. The ranch owner takes a gamble to reunite her with extremely wealthy grandparents who were unaware she existed at all.

Desperado – Wonder Horse Book Three is about a young, courageous horse who saved his rider and ten other horses and riders from the second-largest forest fire in Colorado history.

Desert Rose – Wonder Horse Book Four is about a group of young people and their horses who spend days searching the desert, suffering from high temperatures and seasonal flash flooding, for a stolen and abandoned stallion.

Freedom – Wonder Horse Book Five is about an abused young horse that can't trust humans and a young autistic boy who can't communicate. They meet in an equine therapy setting and go on to challenge the Tevis Cup Race.

Kashmir – Wonder Horse Book Six is about a horse neglected for years that meets a severely depressed young girl who thinks her life is over. Together, they tackle a sport that historically restricts Arabian horses. They do so well in competition, they prove the versatility of his breed, and the girl wins her crown.

Raven – Wonder Horse Book Seven is about a young horse who loses her family and home when her owner dies. A young Brazilian boy immigrates to the USA and loses his parents a month later. Both suffer unimaginable grief until the boy's grandparents purchase the horse from a rescue for their grandson, and the pair go on to do something the boy always dreamed of doing.

Sarah Lea – Wonder Horse Book Eight is about a horse who can never be ridden, therefore becomes unwanted and neglected until she meets a young girl with Cerebral Palsy who can't walk. Together they learn to drive.
